Placement Scores

We are an open admissions college and use ACT scores for course placement. If you did not score an 18 in English, 19 in math and/or a 16 composite, you will need support courses. We offer the ACCUPLACER Exam if you do not have ACT scores or if you want to try to place directly into college level courses. Taking the ACCUPLACER is free to you the first time it is taken! Talk to your Advisor about the benefits of taking the ACCUPLACER.

First Semester

Your Advisor will work with you on your degree requirements. If you did not place into college level courses, no need to worry! You will be ON-TRACK by taking college algebra with the support course, English composition with the support course, and one additional course called an elective. Our data shows if you complete these courses in the first year, you are ON-TRACK to graduation!

Your Schedule

Every student's schedule can be different based on their college major and personal commitments. An honest discussion with your Advisor will help you determine the track that works best for you. We know investing more time in class and learning will keep you ON-TRACK to success!

What is ON-TRACK?

ON-TRACK is LSUE's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) to improve student success and degree completion by providing additional support for your first general education English and math courses.

How Can You Get ON-TRACK?



CREDIT HOURS

- Register for five courses (at 3 credit hours each).
- Gives you full-time status for Financial Aid/TOPS. Complete math and English in the first semester. Saves you \$\$\$ plus fastest progress towards your degree!
- On campus approximately 3 days/week.



CREDIT HOURS

- Register for four courses (at 3 credit hours each).
- Gives you full-time status for Financial Aid/TOPS. Complete math and English in the first semester. Fast progress towards your degree!
- On campus approximately 3 days/week.



CREDIT HOURS

- Register for three courses (at 3 credit hours each).
- Financial Aid eligible.
- Provides flexibility, but slower progress towards your degree.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT DOES IT MEAN IF I'M IN THE PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS PROGRAM?

If you are in the Pathways to Success Program, you will take Orientation to University Studies, along with first-year English and math and the needed support courses. Attendance in face-to-face classes and tutoring is required to ensure your success. When you complete these courses, you are *ON-TRACK*!

WHY AM I TAKING TWO ENGLISH AND/OR MATH COURSES IN A SEMESTER?

Placement scores determine if you need to take a support course while taking first-year college English and/or math. The support course does not count toward your degree but gets you up to speed to be successful in first-year college English and/or math. You will be concurrently enrolled in two linked English and/or math courses.



CREDIT HOURS

- Register for two courses (at 3 credit hours each).
- Financial Aid eligible.
- Reduced time commitment, but slower progress towards your degree.



CREDIT HOURS

- Register for one course (at 3 credit hours).
- Least options for Financial Aid or scholarships.
- Slowest progress towards your degree, least time commitment.



WHAT DOES CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT MEAN?

Concurrent enrollment means you will take linked courses in first-year English and/or math in the same semester. This is for your success! If you add or drop from a linked course, you must also add or drop the second course. ALWAYS talk to your Advisor BEFORE changing your schedule!
